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STEVE TSHWETE MAINTAINS TOP SPOT IN MPUMALANGA AS MATRIC RESULTS IMPROVE

 $m{M}$ bombela - The matriculation results in Mpumalanga for the year 2023 have showcased a commendable improvement of 0.2%, with the province achieving an overall pass rate of 77%, compared to 76.8% in the preceding year.

This announcement has triggered varied responses from political parties within the province.

Democratic Alliance MPL Jane Sithole extended congratulations to the learners for their efforts despite facing challenges like load shedding and infrastructure backlogs.

She emphasized concerns about a high level of dropouts, urging the government to focus on learner retention and expedite infrastructure development.

Sithole highlighted the return of R395 million to the treasury while schools like Mkhondo Boarding School await completion.

In a contrasting view, Economic Freedom Fighters Chief Whip Ntsako Mkhabela expressed dissatisfaction with the 0.2% improvement, citing a decline in the Bohlabela District from 79% to 69%.

Mkhabela criticized the Department's planning capacity, urging a focus on striving for a more substantial increase in results.

ACTIONSA Provincial Chairperson Thoko Mashiane, while acknowledging Mpumalanga's eighth national ranking, applauded learners from rural areas for their success, emphasizing that a conducive learning environment is more critical than glamorous school

The Executive Mayor of Steve Tshwete Local Municipality, Cllr Mhlonishwa Masilela, expressed his excitement about the municipality maintaining the top spot in Mpumalanga, achieving an overall pass rate of 89.5%.

Masilela commended learners and teachers for their outstanding work and thanked social partners like Thungela, RMC, and 4 SAI Military Base for their extra lessons camps.

Mpumalanga Department of Education MEC Bonakele Majuba shared his joy over the 77% pass rate, indicating a 0.2% improvement from

the previous year.

Of the learners, 21,819 qualified for bachelor programs, while 17,412 qualified for diploma programs, showcasing quality results.

District-wise, Bohlabela recorded a 69.1% pass rate (down from 79.3% in 2022), Ehlanzeni achieved 81.8% (an improvement from 76.2% in 2022), Gert Sibande registered 79.8% (up from 77.7% in 2022), and Nkangala obtained 76.4% (an improvement from 74.5% in 2022).

Majuba congratulated Steve Tshwete Local Municipality for its 89.5% pass rate, with Steve Tshwete 2 emerging as the best-performing circuit in the province, achieving a 91.1% pass rate.

Nkomazi East Circuit showed the most improvement, increasing its results by 17.4% to achieve a 77.6% pass rate.

Boarding schools displayed notable performances:

eMakhazeni Boarding School achieved a 46.4% pass rate. eZakheni Boarding School achieved a 74.5% pass rate. **Shongwe Boarding School** achieved a 95.4% pass rate.

Izimbali Boarding School achieved a 95.7% pass rate.

Steve Tshwete Boarding School achieved a 92.6% pass rate.

Thaba Chweu Boarding School, in its inaugural year for grade 12,

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MPUMALANGA MEC SHONGWE URGES LAW ENFORCEMENT TO PRIORITISE MENTAL **HEALTH AMID TRAGIC INCIDENT**

Mpumalanga - In the aftermath of a distressing incident in Carolina where a police constable allegedly shot and killed his spouse and her mother, Mr. Vusi Shongwe, the MEC for Community Safety, Security, and Liaison, is urging law enforcement officers to urging law enforcement officers to prioritise seeking help rather than resorting to violence. This incident has sparked concerns

as it involves those entrusted with protecting communities becoming

perpetrators of crime, particularly domestic violence. Shongwe emphasises, "Police officers should be on the frontlines to prevent crime.

They cannot be part of the crime. If they are experiencing problems, they must seek help and not take it out on other people."

He encourages officers to consider alternative outlets for their frustrations.

alternative outlets for their frustrations and stresses the need to seek assistance during challenging times.

The MEC suggests that health and wellness units available in workplaces

should be optimally utilised to prevent tragic outcomes.

He notes, "The services of health and wellness units in the workplace must be optimally utilised to prevent these types of tragedies."

these types of tragedies."

These units can provide essential support and counselling for officers dealing with stress, anxiety, or other mental health issues, fostering a culture of proactive mental well-be-

ing.
Shongwe also advocates for increased awareness within relationships, advising people to be vigilant for signs of abuse or distress

He urges couples to seek professional help, stating, "If they feel their differences can't be resolved, it is better to well a way." better to walk away.

This proactive approach, he believes, can prevent tragedies before they escalate, emphasising the importance of addressing issues before they become insurmountable.

Expressing concern for the impact on the children left behind, who must now navigate life without their parents, Shongwe highlights the potential negative effects on their revelological well being and the psychological well-being and the

trauma they are likely to endure.

He concludes, "The children will now have to live without their parents, and this alone might impact negatively

on their psychological well-being.
Let alone the trauma that they are going through. It is very disturbing."
In conclusion, Mr. Vusi Shongwe's call for law enforcement officers to prioritise seeking help and utilising

available support services is crucial in preventing tragic incidents like the one in Carolina.

By addressing the mental health of those entrusted with public safety, we can contribute to creating a safer environment for both officers and the communities they serve.

Upstream Petroleum Resources Development Bill [B13B-2021]

The Portfolio Committee on Agriculture, Rural Development, Land and Environmental Affairs and the Chairperson, Hon KJ Macie, MPL, hereby invite members of the public, interested parties and stakeholders wishing to make comments or inputs on the above-mentioned Bill.

Purpose of the Upstream Petroleum Resources Development Bill [B13B-2021]

To provide for orderly development of petroleum resources;

To provide for equitable access to, and sustainable development of, the nation's petroleum resources;

To provide for active State and black persons' participation in the development of the nation's petroleum resources;

To provide for a petroleum right that integrates the right to explore and to produce;

To provide for the facilitation of acquisition of petroleum geo-technical data;

To provide for a controlled application system through licensing rounds;

To create an enabling environment for the acceleration of exploration and production of the nation's petroleum resources;

To provide for third party access to upstream petroleum infrastructure;

To provide for a petroleum right holder to sell a percentage of petroleum to the State for strategic stock requirements;

To designate a state-owned company as an entity responsible for managing the State's carried interest in petroleum rights;

To provide for the advancement of national developmental imperatives by the state-owned company through the development of petroleum resources;

To provide for the holder of a petroleum right to retain its empowerment status after the exit of black persons under circumscribed circumstances;

To provide for local content as a development strategy to enable skills development, local recruitment and national participation through supply of goods and services;

To designate the Petroleum Agency of South Africa as the regulatory authority for the upstream petroleum sector; and to provide for matters connected therewith.

MPUMALANGA MOURNS THE LOSS OF PARLIA-

MENTARIAN VIOLET SIZANI SIWELA

 $m{B}$ ushbuckridge- On Thursday, South Africa mourned the passing of Member of Parliament Violet Sizani Siwela, who spent her final days in the Intensive Care Unit. Born in Bushbuckridge 67 years ago, Siwela dedicated almost three decades of her life to education as a teacher and primary school principal in Mpumalanga.

Siwela's public service extended beyond the realm of education, with notable roles in Mpumalanga provincial and local government. She began her political journey as a ward councillor for the ANC in the Bushbuckridge Local Municipality in 2000, later joining the provincial legislature in 2005.

Over the years, Siwela held various positions in the legislature, including roles in the Mpumalanga Executive Council under former Premier David Mabuza. Notably, she served as a member of the Executive Council for Agriculture from 2013 to 2014 and as a member of the Executive Council

for Human Settlements from 2014 to 2016.

She later assumed the position of Speaker of the Mpumalanga Provincial Legislature from March 2018 until May 2019.

In the 2019 general election, she was elected to the National Assembly.

The African National Congress (ANC), Siwela's political home, expressed deep sorrow over her passing.

passing of one of the dedicated leaders of the African National Congress

(ANC), Comrade Violet Sizani Siwela.

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





SOUTH AFRICA 0-0 TUNISIA – BAFANA BAFANA THROUGH TO AFRICA CUP OF NA-TIONS LAST 16 AS EAGLES OF CARTHAGE EXIT

South Africa booked their place in the last 16 of the 2023 Africa Cup of Nations following a battling 0-0 draw against Tunisia, a result that sees the latter crash out of the tournament having finished bottom of Group E.

In a game of few meaningful chances, Bafana Banafa did enough to keep the 2004 winners at bay and advance to the next round of the competition.

Tunisia joined Ghana and Algeria on the 2023 Africa Cup of Nations scrapheap after going out of the competition with barely a whimper.

They needed to beat South Africa to reach the last 16 but were held to a goalless draw in a sluggish match of few chances.

Tunisia's only clear opportunity came in the 89th minute, when the substitute Haythem Jouini headed over from six yards.

That led to a brief injury-time flurry, but for the rest of the game the Eagles of Carthage played with a peculiar lack of intensity.

South Africa created the better openings before that, although neither keeper had a particularly difficult save to make in what is surely the dullest game of the tournament to date.

A goal at the death would have put Tunisia through and South Africa out. Instead, with Namibia and Mali also drawing 0-0, South Africa finished second in Group E.

They will play the winner of Group F, possibly Morocco, next Tuesday.
