

ATHOLIC PRIEST SHOT DEAD INSIDE CATHEDRAL

Tzaneen, Limpopo - As word spreads about the horrifying murder of 38-year-old Catholic priest Fr. William Banda, the festive spirit of Easter has been eclipsed by tragedy in the Catholic Diocese of Tzaneen, South Africa. Fr. Banda, a member of the St. Patrick's Missionary Society (Kiltegan Fathers), was preparing to celebrate Holy Mass at the Holy Trinity Cathedral when he was fatally shot in the head.

The incident occurred early Wednesday morning when Fr. Banda was in the sacristy, making final preparations for the service. According to reports, a "well-dressed man" entered the sacristy and, without warning, shot the priest twice in the head before fleeing the scene. Despite the swift response of police and emergency medical personnel, Fr. Banda was pronounced dead upon arrival at a nearby hospital.

The community of Tzaneen is reeling from the shock of this senseless act of violence against a beloved member of the clergy. Fr. Banda, originally from Zambia, was known for his dedication to his parishioners and his commitment to spreading the message of peace and love.

Police spokesperson Col. Malesela Ledwaba described the incident as "heinous" and confirmed that investigations into Fr. Banda's murder are currently underway. The identity of the perpetrator remains unknown, but law enforcement authorities are urging anyone with information to come forward and assist in the investigation.

Provincial Commissioner Lt-Gen. Thembi Hadebe has assigned the murder and robbery unit to lead the investigation, emphasising the urgency of apprehending the individual responsible for this tragic crime. Lt-Col. Richard Boshomane and Warrant Officer Phaladi Makola have been designated as points of contact for community members wishing to provide information.

As Easter approaches, the Catholic community in Tzaneen mourns the loss of Fr. William Banda while grappling with the incomprehensible violence that has shattered their sense of peace and security. Amid this darkness, they cling to the hope and promise of the Easter season, seeking solace in their faith and unity as they come together to support one another in the wake of this devastating loss.

The late Father William Banda was shot in the head and died while preparing to

Ridgeview - Mpumalanga's Dipaleseng community in Ridgeview celebrated a double win on Monday.

Mpumalanga MEC for Human Settlements, Speedy Mashilo, joined residents for the official opening of a brand new

multi-million-rand childcare centre and the handover of 180 title deeds.

The Childcare Centre addresses a critical need in the community by providing a safe and familiar environment for early childhood development (ECD) programmes.

Previously, residents had to send their children far away for ECD, which was a financial burden for many families.

"This community needed a centre like this," said MEC Mashilo. "Now, children can learn and grow in a familiar setting close to home."

Empowerment came in another form with the distribution of title deeds.

The local executive mayor, Cllr. Khethiwe Moeketsi, hailed the handover as a significant step towards a stronger socio-economic future for Ridgeview.

"The MEC's visit signifies a positive change for the community," she stated. "With these title deeds, residents are no longer simply occupants, but property owners.

This empowers them to leverage economic opportunities."

The joy was evident on the face of Ms. Jane Ngubeni (82), one of the title deed recipients.

"I'm so grateful for this document," she said. "It secures my future and the future of my grandson." Ngubeni and her family relocated from nearby Monareng settlements to their new Ridgeview home in late 2023.

The Ridgeview integrated settlements project is a comprehensive one, encompassing over 3,500 sites with 1,500 housing units already completed and occupied.

Looking ahead, MEC Mashilo announced that 60% of the remaining sites will be available for purchase for those who wish to build their own homes.

The remaining 40% will be allocated for further low-cost housing projects.

This Ridgeview handover is a positive step forward, and similar initiatives are planned for other parts of Mpumalanga.

The future looks brighter for the Dipaleseng community, with both their children's education and their economic opportunities receiving a significant boost.

South Africa - In a historic development for South Africa's banking sector, the Reserve Bank has approved the registration of the country's first-ever female-owned mutual bank.

The official statement from the Reserve Bank reads: "Notice is hereby given for general information, by the provisions of Section 27(a) of the Act, that YWBN Mutual Bank was registered as a mutual bank with effect from January 22, 2024."

With its registration, YWBN Mutual Bank became the first bank in South Africa to be owned entirely by women of all races, which is a historic moment in the country's banking history.

Managing Director Nthabeleng Likotsi, expressing her elation, stated, "I learned in September 2014 that black people could own the bank if they worked together; since then, not a day has gone by without me saying, 'We shall own the bank' and without the YWBN TEAM and YWBN

registering the bank."

After nine years of dedicated effort, Likotsi and her team have finally realised their dream of owning a bank.

Despite facing numerous challenges and detractors along the way, Likotsi emphasised the perseverance and determination of the YWBN team.

"We had many detractors, who went as far as using state-owned entities to attack, but we stood firm, blocked the noise, and focused on the end goal," she remarked.
The approval of YWBN Mutual Bank is

a significant step forward for female representation in the banking sector, breaking barriers and paving the way for more diversity and inclusion in the


Mutual banks tend to be more fiscally conservative than large commercial banks, opting for stable investments to support their depositors. Furthermore, without shareholders,

mutual banks are not pressured to grow at the same rate as commercial banks, allowing for a more stable and sustainable approach to banking.

Following the liquidation of VBS Bank, YWBN enters the fray as the fourth mutual bank in the country, joining Bank Zero Mutual Bank, Finbond Mutual Bank, and GBS Mutual Bank.

In her closing remarks, Likotsi thanked the resilience and dedication of each team member for sticking together throughout the nine-year journey until their dream was realised.

Lt. Col. Maluleke's sudden passing has left a void in the hearts of his colleagues and the media community.


Many have expressed their sympathies and shared memories of his kindness, professionalism, and unwavering commitment to justice.

COAL MAFIA ACCUSED: MINE STANDOFF SPARKS PROTESTS

Sandton - Over a thousand members of the Mpumalanga Action Movement and the National Union of Mineworkers (NUM) marched to the Sandton offices of Glencore, Seriti, and Thungela on Friday last week.

Their frustration stemmed from the ongoing closure of Optimum Coal Mine in Mpumalanga, which was slated to resume operations on March 8th but remains shuttered.

The protestors believe Glencore, which they call the "head of the COAL MAFIA," is colluding with Seriti and Thungela to hinder the reopening.

They allege that these companies conspired in December 2022 to suspend Optimum Coal's rail division and port rights at the Richards Bay Coal Terminal, aiming to control export profits from the

Community leader Hophney Moramaga highlighted the devastating impact of the closure: "The closure of Optimum Coal has brought a lot of poverty, pain, and strife to the communities that have depended on this coal mine for decades."

He emphasized the mine's historical role in sustaining local livelihoods and the

regional economy.

Demanding the handover of the Richards Bay Coal Terminal to Optimum Coal, the protestors threatened to disrupt the operations of Glencore, Seriti, and Thungela until their demand was met.

"Back terminal Coal will be handed over voluntarily or not!" declared Mora-

maga.
"There is no political protection that will save them.

If OPTIMUM COAL DOESN'T WORK, then SERETI, THUNGELA and GLENCORE will not work until they hand over the coal terminal."

Moramaga pointed to the February 2nd, 2024, North Gauteng High Court ruling that resolved the legal issues surrounding the mine and terminal.

He argued that Glencore, Seriti, and Thungela are obstructing the mine's sale to Liberty Coal by refusing to relinquish control of the terminal.

The protest lays bare the complex situation surrounding the Optimum Coal Mine. Allegations of corruption and the community's economic anxieties demand a swift and transparent resolution.

Whether negotiations or further legal action will determine the future of the mine and its impact on the Mpumalanga communities remains to be seen.

STORM RIPS THROUGH HOMES, **FAMILIES DISPLACED**

Nkomazi, Mpumalanga - A devastating storm tore through Nkomazi, east of Mbombela in Mpumalanga, last Wednesday, leaving a trail of destruction in its wake.

Dozens of families from six villages, including Masibekela, GaNwandlane, and Chief Albert Luthuli, are now grappling with the aftermath.

Homes were left with gaping holes where roofs once stood, exposing furniture and belongings to the elements.

Power lines snapped, plunging homes into darkness, and roads became treacherous with fallen trees and debris.

The human cost of the storm is also significant. Several people suffered injuries during the storm's fury, requiring hospitalisation.

Now, with their homes uninhabitable,

families face the daunting task of picking up the pieces.

In Masibekela, Maria Ndlovu and her unemployed husband huddled with their seven children to safety after the storm had ravaged their home. "We ran for cover, but everything is damaged," Ndlovu laments.

"We have no place to sleep, and the children have lost their school uniforms

We rely on the children's support grant, and now we have nothing. We desperately need help."

Nkomazi Local Municipality is scrambling

to assess the full extent of the damage. "We're moving from village to village," says spokesperson Cyril Ripinga. "Our priority right now is to provide temporary shelter for those who lost their homes completely. We're also reaching out to other departments and organisations for assistance with food, blankets, and potentially even rebuilding efforts." The storm serves as a stark reminder of the vulnerability of communities to extreme weather events. With the rainy season still in its early stages, concerns are mounting about the potential for further damage. Local authorities are urging residents to remain vigilant and take precautions against future storms.

Meanwhile, a call to action has been issued for NGOs, charities, and the public to support the affected families. Donations of food, clothing, blankets, and building materials are urgently needed to help these communities rebuild their lives.

MPUMALANGA REELS FROM CRIME SURGE, EHLANZENI WORST HIT

Ehlanzeni - Mpumalanga faces an unsettling rise in crime, with a concerning surge in murder, rape, hijacking, and

kidnapping cases.

The Mpumalanga Provincial Police Commissioner, Lieutenant-General Semakaleng Manamela, and MEC for Community Safety, Security and Liaison, Vusi Shongwe, released the troubling third-quarter crime statistics in Mbombela last week on Tuesday.

The statistics reveal a particularly sharp increase in contact crimes within the Ehlanzeni region.

Authorities expressed deep concern over this trend. The data showed a staggering 490 murders and over 900 rape cases reported in the third quarter of 2023 alone, representing a significant rise compared to the same period in the previous year.

Experts are now dissecting the factors driving the crime surge in Ehlanzeni.

Socio-economic issues like unemployment and poverty are suspected culprits, while the easy availability of firearms and a potential culture of violence are also being examined.

Police are further investigating the role of organised crime syndicates in the increase of hijackings and kidnappings.

A glimmer of hope exists with decreased cash-in-transit heists, house robberies, and business robberies.

However, authorities remain cautious. They are investigating a potential link between alcohol consumption and the rise

MEC for Community Safety, Security

MEC Shongwe's announcement of increased tavern inspections on "overall Fridays."
"Murder is our main concern, and in most of these cases, guns and sharp objects are the weapons of choice," stated Lt. Gen Semakaleng Manamela.

He outlined plans to increase police visibility in high-crime areas and imple-

ment stricter gun control measures. Vusi Shongwe, Mpumalanga Community Safety, Security, and Liaison MEC, acknowledged the need for a multi-pronged approach.

"Wê've implemented 'overall Fridays' where we target taverns to ensure compliance with regulations and patron safety,

Shongwe also emphasised plans to collaborate with community leaders and social development organisations to address the root causes of crime and foster a culture of peace within Mpumalanga.

The significant rise in crime, especially in Ehlanzeni District, demands a swift and comprehensive response.

While the police are stepping up efforts, community cooperation is crucial

Reporting suspicious activity and participating in neighbourhood watch programmes can significantly aid law enforcement.

Addressing the socioeconomic factors that contribute to crime is essential for long-term success.

By working together, law enforcement, community leaders, and residents can create a safer Mpumalanga for all.

MASHABA FACES FRESH ALLEGATIONS IN LIMPOPO SCANDAL

Limpopo - Convicted criminal Howard Mashaba faces fresh allegations of embezzlement in a wide-ranging corruption scandal engulfing the National Lotteries Commission (NLC).

The Special Investigative Unit (SIU) is probing Mashaba for allegedly diverting R34 million earmarked for cultural projects in Limpopo, including a failed music festival, to companies and individuals linked to him.

This investigation is part of a larger effort to address mismanagement and financial losses within the NLC, estimated at a staggering R1.4 billion.

President Cyril Ramaphosa authorised the probe in 2020, highlighting the seriousness of the situation.

The SIU has uncovered a complex scheme where Mashaba allegedly funnelled funds through companies believed to be under his control, despite not holding official directorships in many of them.

Internal reports detail over R34.4 million syphoned off over three years, raising questions about the effectiveness of the NLC's internal processes for ensuring fair funding allocation.

The investigation takes a disturbing turn as it reveals how Mashaba may have used family members to further his alleged scheme.

Companies were reportedly registered in their names, potentially leading to their being blacklisted due to unpaid debts and fraudulent transactions.

This reportedly includes his parents, in-laws, and even his alleged girlfriend. Mashaba's past casts a long shadow.

A 2019 conviction for contempt of court related to a debt owed to Mercedes-Benz South Africa raises concerns about his financial dealings.

Despite this conviction, the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) did not oppose his bail application in a separate case later that year.

Currently, Mashaba awaits judgement for allegedly concealing previous convictions during a bail application in 2019. The NLC maintains its commitment to

cooperating with the investigation, but external audits raise questions about the effectiveness of their internal controls. As the SIU delves deeper, further details


regarding Mashaba's alleged involvement and the NLC's internal shortcomings are likely to emerge.

The public awaits the outcome and potential consequences for those implicated in this alleged web of corruption.
